Words cannot describe how nice it is to be together with you again – live and in a real theatre – so, thank you for attending today's production of *Nosferatu w/Little Bang Theory*. What a gift!

We thought long and hard about the 2021-22 season (our 34^{th}), and what it means to us to be back together with you, again. So, we decided to focus all the fall/winter productions around the various fall/winter holidays ... to celebrate! Especially since, last year, we had to spend them quietly and somewhat alone – we are pleased now to be able to celebrate in a bigger, louder, and more unique way!

Nosferatu w/Little Bang Theory is first on the roster as a Halloween celebration – and what better way to celebrate Halloween than with one of the best toy bands and vampire films ever?!?

Mark and I are particularly thrilled to present this production as our season opener because we are enamored with Little Bang Theory. And when we find something so innovative, unique, and delightful, we immediately want to share it with you. This is Little Bang Theory's third performance with Theatre Gigante and some of you may remember the other two: *Animated Films by Ladislaw Starewicz* and the beautiful silent film, *Laugh Clown Laugh*.

Little Bang Theory is otherwise based in Detroit/Ann Arbor, Michigan and is a trio that performs on toys and tiny instruments, featuring artists Frank Pahl, Terri Sarris, and Doug Shimmin. The brainchild of Frank, Little Bang Theory's musical explorations are performed entirely on children's instruments and toys. The three exquisite musicians are constantly picking up new instruments, so the music is constantly shifting. It's not unusual for someone to be playing a melodica with one hand, a metallophone with the other, and stomping on percussion, or Frank to be magnificently whistling, and Terri and Doug soulfully and hauntingly vocalizing.

Today they will perform a graceful and original score by Frank accompanying the most famous vampire movie in history. This classic silent German Expressionist film from 1922 is directed by F.W. Murnau, starring Max Schreck as Count Orlok.

So, German Expressionism and toys ... Nosferatu w/Little Bang Theory and Theatre Gigante ... what a perfect match!

So ... Go quickly, travel safely, my young friend, to the land of ghosts. ... and enjoy the show!

The mysterious Count Orlok summons the real estate agent, Thomas Hutter, to his remote Transylvanian castle in the mountains. The eerie Orlok seeks to buy a house near Hutter and his wife, Ellen. After Orlok reveals his vampire nature, Hutter struggles to escape the castle, knowing that Ellen is in grave danger. Meanwhile Orlok's servant, Knock, prepares for his master to arrive at his new home.

Now in its 34th year, Theatre Gigante enlivens the local performance scene with its unique style of theatre. Gigante brings original, eclectic, and unique productions to the stage and has a strong history of dynamic collaborations with locally, nationally, and internationally known musicians, visual artists, composers, and performers. Besides Milwaukee, it has appeared in Chicago, NYC, Boston, North Carolina, Iowa, Michigan, and Slovenia in the EU. Critically acclaimed, this theatre of big ideas is exciting, challenging, and fresh.

Artistic Directors **Isabelle Kralj & Mark Anderson** are first and foremost storytellers, and they use their eclectic backgrounds to bring many styles and genres to their finished products. Their work has an innovative signature style, combining and seamlessly flowing back and forth between text, dialogue, movement, dance, music, and, at times, video. Apart, and together, they have created over 90 theatre pieces.

About Frank Pahl

Longtime Theatre Gigante collaborator Frank Pahl is a Michigan-based musician/ composer, working in several styles. He has performed throughout North America, Europe, and Asia and has led several groups, including Only A Mother, Scavenger Quartet, and Little Bang Theory. He has composed music for numerous dance and theatre productions and, as a composer, is known for employing an arsenal of instruments...traditional, non-traditional and homemade. He also builds and exhibits automatic instruments. Frank's fascination with, and collection of, toy instruments developed into Little Bang Theory in 2005. He currently teaches Sound Art at College for Creative Studies in Detroit.

About Terri Sarris

Terri Sarris is a media maker and educator who has created and taught courses in experimental and documentary media, television and film production, and dance on screen at the University of Michigan, for nearly thirty years. Her films, shot on 16mm, Super 8 film, and digital media, have screened at festivals and galleries nationally and internationally. About Doug Shimmin

Doug Shimmin has been banging, strumming and singing his way around the metro Detroit area for more than 30 years. As a founding member of the awardwinning multi-ethnic group Immigrant Suns, Doug left behind his punk new wave flavors for the old world. After a great run of touring and performing, he sat down at a tiny table of toy instruments with friends Frank Pahl & Terri Sarris. From there they created Little Bang Theory, and it's been miniature magic ever sense. During the pandemic Doug didn't stop. Creating and co-producing two separate quarantined collaborations that resulted in four releases: Covid Bros.
