BIOGRAPHIES

About THEATRE GIGANTE

Now in its 34th year, Theatre Gigante enlivens the local performance scene with its unique style of theatre. Gigante brings original, eclectic, and unique theatre to the stage and has a strong history of dynamic collaborations with locally, nationally, and internationally known musicians, visual artists, composers, and performers. Besides Milwaukee, it has appeared in Chicago, NYC, Boston, North Carolina, Iowa, Michigan, and Slovenia, EU. The theatre of big ideas, critically acclaimed Theatre Gigante is exciting, challenging, and fresh. Artistic Directors Isabelle Kralj and Mark Anderson are first and foremost storytellers, and they use their eclectic backgrounds to bring many styles and genres to their finished products. Their work has an innovative signature style, combining and seamlessly flowing back and forth between text, dialogue, movement, dance, music, and, at times, video. Apart, and together, they have created over 80 theater pieces.

About Mark Anderson (author/performer)

Theatre Gigante Artistic co-Director Mark Anderson is an artist based in Milwaukee whose work as a monologist, playwright, and interdisciplinary artist has been seen in over thirty cities around the country, and in Europe.

Anderson has worked as a soloist, or in collaboration with many other Milwaukee performing artists and groups, including Present Music, Wild Space Dance Company, Inertia Ensemble, and many times with Theatre X, for whom he wrote several plays, including Quorum.

In 1996, Anderson began working with Gigante founder Isabelle Kralj, and since then they have co-created over eighty original productions, including Petrushka, My Dear Othello, The Beggar's Opera, Three Other Sisters, The Lears, and The Way Things Go.

Anderson has written and performed monologues for Gigante, as well as Links Hall in Chicago, Grinnell College, James Madison University, University of Michigan, and in numerous US cities, including Madison, Chicago, Buffalo, New York, Houston, Los Angeles and Seattle. In 1986-89, he toured with PS122 Field Trips. He received an MFA from the University of Michigan School of Art & Design and a BA in Theatre from Grinnell College. He is presently Adjunct Professor at Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design.

About Frank Pahl (composer/performer)

Longtime and regular Theatre Gigante collaborator Frank Pahl is a Michigan-based musician/composer, working in several styles. He works primarily in Detroit and Ann Arbor, and has exhibited his work in Canada, Europe, and Japan, as well as the United States. He has worked in several groups, including Only A Mother, Sublime Wedge, Immigrant Suns, ScavengerR Quartet, and Little Bang Theory, the "toy" music trio. He has composed music for numerous dance and theatre

productions. As a composer, he is known for employing an arsenal of instruments, from such traditional but not-quite-common instruments as ukuleles and euphoniums to a variety of homemade, automated contraptions. He also builds and exhibits a lot of automatic instruments. His fascination with, and collection of, toy instruments has developed into Little BangTheory, which was last seen by Gigante audiences this past October in NOSFERATU w/LITTLE BANG THEORY.

About Isabelle Kralj (director)

Isabelle Kralj is the Founder, and Artistic Co-Director, of Theatre Gigante and works as an auteur, director, choreographer, and performer. Besides Gigante, she has directed and/or choreographed for, among others, Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, First Stage Milwaukee, Milwaukee Repertory Theater, Florentine Opera, DBUS (Ballet Assn. of Slovenia) and Door Shakespeare. Abroad, where she was a member of the Slovenian National Theatre Ballet, she has performed in Slovenia, Italy, Croatia, Austria, and Germany. Kralj has an MFA in Dance, and she has been on the faculty of University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Alverno College, and University School of Milwaukee, where she created and implemented a dance program. Kralj received a New Choreography Award from the Wisconsin Arts Board, and the award of High Artistic Achievement from UWM's Slovenian Arts Council, and grants from the US State Department, U.S. Embassy in Slovenia. and the Slovenian Ministry of Culture. Some of Kralj's most critically acclaimed work includes A SOLDIER'S TALE, METAMORPHOSIS, ENEMY OF THE PEOPLE, and A COSMIC FAIRY TALE A DAY KEEPS THE DOCTOR AWAY. She has written/created over eighty works, many of them in collaboration with Mark Anderson, who also happens to be her life's collaborator.

About Alan Piotrowicz (lighting designer)

ALAN PIOTROWICZ (Lighting Design) previously designed lighting for Theatre Gigante's TERMINUS and lighting and sets for METAMORPHOSIS and ENEMY OF THE PEOPLE. He has designed for several companies in and around Milwaukee, including All In Productions, Cooperative Performance, Danceworks, Falls Patio Players, First Stage Children's Theatre, In Tandem Theatre, Milwaukee Repertory Theatre, Milwaukee Chamber Theatre, Next Act Theatre, Renaissance Theaterworks, Sunstone Studios, Theatre Gigante, Theater RED, and Windfall Theatre. His work also includes designs for TITAN Theatre Company in New York City, Hope Summer Repertory Theatre in Holland, MI, and Brief Cameo Productions and the Ivoryton Playhouse in Ivoryton, CT. He is a proud board member of Cooperative Performance and Brief Cameo Productions. He received his training at UW-Madison and The Santa Fe Opera. www.alanpiotrowicz.com

About Sam Fitzwater-Butchart (technical director/light board operator) Theatre Gigante's resident Technical Director, Samuel Fitzwater-Butchart, is a Milwaukee native who has worked for theater companies such as Skylight Music Theatre, Next-Act Theatre, and Gigante. He currently also holds resident positions with Three Crows Theatre (IL) where he has worked on OUR COUNTRY'S GOOD, TROJAN WOMEN, THESE SHINING LIVES, and with Open Door Theatre (VT) where he has worked on PROOF, MY MOTHER'S 3 MOTHERS PAST. For Theatre Gigante he has worked on METAMORPHOSIS, TARZAN, SPALDING GRAY: STORIES LEFT TO TELL, and CRAVE, and NOSFERATU w/LITTLE BANG THEORY, among others.
